

Information clause:

In accordance with Article 13 of Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data, and repealing Directive 95/46/EC (i.e. General Data Protection Regulation) (OJ EU.L 2016 No. 119, p. 1), hereinafter referred to as GDPR, we inform you that:

1. The administrator of your personal data is the Rzeszów University of Technology named after Ignacy Łukasiewicz, with its registered office at al. Powstańców Warszawy 12, 35-959 Rzeszów, phone no. +48 17 865 1100, e-mail address: kancelaria@prz.edu.pl.
2. The Administrator has appointed a Data Protection Officer to supervise the correctness of personal data processing, who can be contacted by phone at 17 865 1775 or by e-mail at iod@prz.edu.pl, in any matter concerning the processing of your personal data and the exercise of rights related to the processing of personal data.
3. Your personal data will be processed for the purpose of:
 - a) establishing initial contact with you, pursuant to Article 6 paragraph 1 letter a of the GDPR (consent to the processing of personal data);
 - b) provision of services by the Administrator by electronic means within the meaning of the provisions of the Act of 18 July 2002 on the provision of services by electronic means (consolidated text: Journal of Laws of 2019, item 123, as amended), consisting in sending information about events organized by the Department of Foundry and Welding to the e-mail address provided by you by the Administrator - based on a separate consent granted (Article 6, paragraph 1, letter a of the GDPR);
4. Your data may also be processed regardless of the consent expressed in connection with the pursuit/defense of claims, on the basis of Article 6, Article 1, letter f of the GDPR (processing is necessary for the purposes resulting from the legitimate interests pursued by the administrator).
5. Providing data is voluntary, but necessary to achieve the purposes for which they were collected. Refusal to provide them (not expressing consent to their processing) is equivalent to the inability to establish initial contact or to the inability to receive information about events organized by the Department of Foundry and Welding.
6. Your personal data will not be made available to external entities, except in cases provided for by law.
7. Your personal data will not be transferred to a recipient in a third country or an international organization.
8. The Administrator may entrust the processing of your personal data to external entities acting on behalf of the Administrator, e.g. an entity providing IT services in the field of servicing and removing failures in IT systems.

9. In the case of achieving the purpose of establishing initial contact, your personal data will be processed until the purpose of processing is achieved or until the consent constituting the basis for this processing is withdrawn or an objection is filed to the processing of data. In the case of the purpose of informing about events organized by the Department of Foundry and Welding, your personal data will be processed until you withdraw your consent, which is the basis for this processing, or you object to the processing of these data. Your personal data may be processed during the limitation period for claims related to the processing of these data for the purposes specified above.

10. You have the right to access the content of your data, to rectify it or limit its processing, and the right to object to its processing or to its deletion, if permitted by law, as well as the right to transfer your data to another entity by sending an appropriate e-mail message to zois@prz.edu.pl.

11. You have the right to withdraw your consent at any time without affecting the lawfulness of the processing carried out on the basis of consent before its withdrawal, subject to the provisions of the law, by sending an appropriate e-mail message to zois@prz.edu.pl.

12. You have the right to lodge a complaint with the supervisory authority (i.e. the President of the Personal Data Protection Office) if you consider that the processing of your personal data violates the provisions of the GDPR.

13. Your data will not be subject to automated decision-making processes (including profiling).
